

ARE YOU ANXIOUS?

In this world, on the average day, we all have something we're anxious about: getting to work on time; a situation we know we need to deal with today; a relationship; worrying about a loved one. We might have an irrational fear about what "might" happen today. Anxiety is a reflection of our fear about daily living. I remember having fear, some anxiety, with the start of a new school year. I've been reminded of that talking to parents at church and with my own grandchildren recently.

Psalm 56:3 says, "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you." Notice it doesn't say, "I never struggle with fear." It assumes fear and anxiety will strike us all! For example, 1 Peter 5:7 says, "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." Again, it doesn't say you will never be anxious. Rather, it says when you are anxious, cast it upon God.

I suppose we all try to hide our fear and anxiety like it's weakness or not normal. But, why? Scripture seems to indicate that it's normal, although sinful because it points to our distrust in the promises of God. Perhaps instead of hiding it, it's more important to know how to fight it.

Here's how we do it: We fight anxieties by fighting against unbelief and fighting for faith in future grace. Timothy says you have to fight the "good fight." This is done by meditating on God's assurances of future grace and by asking for the help to experience it

I just had to replace my wife's windshield wipers recently. She was so happy! She doesn't feel safe when they don't make the windshield clean (plus that irritating skip!). When dirt is on it, she always squirts windshield fluid on and wipes it away. When it rains just a little, she turns her wipers on because she temporarily loses sight.

For this discussion of anxiety and fear, consider the windshield wipers to be the promises of God, and the washer fluid is the Holy Spirit. Thessalonians 2:13 basically says the sin of anxiety is fought by truth and spirit. These two things are our faith builders. The Spirit softens us up for the truth to sanctify us. Spirit softens our

disbelief of the promises of God. In the words of our analogy, the washer fluid softens the dirt so the wipers can wipe it clean.

"Wipe" your anxiety away using the tools of God's truth and the Spirit so this might be true in your life.... "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4: 6-7)

By now, you've most likely heard Pastor Kurt mention the Franklin Graham "God Loves You" tour. You may recall that he offered details about the Christian Life and Witness Course sessions that the tour folks gave to any who were interested, whether you were wanting to volunteer for the Sept. 25th program or not. Maybe you considered attending. Or maybe you weren't so sure you'd be comfortable talking to complete strangers in the middle of the York Expo Center, but you started to feel like God was calling the event to your attention for a reason. And when you caught sight of the big billboard at the corner of Roosevelt and Rte. 30, you wondered if it was posted for your benefit!

I hope that like me, you have been listening to those nudges. This is one of those events that will truly offer our neighbors a hand up—to the one who brings the truth and the life in a world that has lost its way to both. “NEVER DIE” CAR SHOW 2022

In its third year now, our car show continues to be blessed by God and a blessing to our community! I thank those that participated in any way for our success. I thank God for great weather. Thank you!

While Chip Foeks spearheaded the BBQ side of the event, let me offer some information related to the car show side of the event: 124 cars/cycles registered (plus about 6 that were not), 11 Power Wheels vehicles, registered, 18 volunteers over two months – gave about 80 manhours, approximately 500 people attended, a blessing was prayed and gospel message delivered to about 150 people, gave out 90 car blessing stickers and 25 kid’s gift bags, gave out invitations to the Franklin Graham event, and raised \$1482 for the ministries of our church.

The primary reason this was started was as a fundraiser. But, let me offer this witness:

One gentleman told me he goes to lots of car shows, even lots of church sponsored shows, but there is something special about ours. I prayed for him and he was so appreciative of all that we do. I have had an ongoing relationship with his father because of the car shows.

I also had a gentleman who has come every year to support our show. He said he would never miss it. I first met him at the gym. We talked about faith and I presented the gospel. I also prayed for him. I think that’s why he comes.

I also met and talked to a new widower and invited him to our Grief Share ministry.

I reconnected with another gentleman that had attended our church sporadically as a new participant when I first started. He told me his current story. I encouraged him, and he thanked me for spending time with him.

I also spent time with a neighbor that lives across the street from the church. He had his daughter there who got to play. He also testified to addiction and how he got saved this year. He appreciated that he could celebrate his story with me!

I was also told that our show was some inspiration for another church who will hold a show in the Dover area.

I’ll bet others could tell of similar God moments. Please share them with me if you have them!

A church requires money, and I thank the Lord that He provides thru events like this. But our goal is always to make God’s mighty work known and make disciples of Jesus Christ. We do that by building relationships with people. The show is just an excuse to invite people into relationship. Please pray today for next year’s success. Many told me personally what a great day it was. I thank the church for supporting this ministry! PK

Greetings New Creation Community Church! I am pleased to announce that New Creation Station and the State of Pennsylvania have reached a settlement agreement. In a nutshell, our daycare is now in the final stage of licensing after violations related to our temporary closing over a year ago. Within the next 30 days we will have our large-scale inspection to return us to a provisional status.

The dedication of Director Sherry Chubb and her staff have made this possible. They have tirelessly worked hand in hand with our Department of Human Services (DHS) representative to correct past issues and implement best practices going forward. I ask for your continued prayer and congratulations to the staff for the work thus far.

We currently have 24 students and 11 full- or part-time staff. However, we lack enough staff to accomplish additional items to continue improving the ministry. Would you donate some time to help us work on some projects? Talk to Director Sherry Chubb about the details, but any amount of help would be a blessing!

We are currently accepting donations of toys, books, and seasonal items for our classes.
